



La Vieille Ferme Ventoux Rosé 2013

PRESENTATION

La Vieille Ferme Rosé has everything you would expect from a good rosé wine. Fruit, freshness and a beautiful colour. Ideal as an aperitif or with a meal amongst friends...

THE VINTAGE

The vintage started with a long winter and one of the driest ones in the past years followed by an inexistent Spring. The crop development was very slow due to important climatic variations. The winemakers' work was therefore crucial to get good quality grapes in small quantities. 2013 was a complicated vintage and late but is wonderfully balanced and is very promising.

LOCATION

Situated on the slopes of Mont Ventoux, the vineyard benefits from a cooler climate than down in the plain. The grapes mature slowly and maintain a good acidity. The wine is rich, fresh, balanced.

TERROIR

Sediment left by the seas of the Tertiary period at the base of the chalky Mont Ventoux. Red Mediterranean soils originating from cretaceous hard chalk, calcareous debris and round stones from old alluvium.

AGEING

Bleeding in stainless steel tanks

VARIETALS

Cinsault, Grenache, Syrah

SERVING

10-12°C in tulip shaped glasses.

TASTING

Colour: beautiful pink and red tones. Nose: floral with hints of aniseed and brown sugar. Mouth: aromas of white flowers, cherries and fruit drops.
