





Famille Perrin Côtes du Rhône Villages Cairanne "Peyre Blanche"

Our 14 hectare vineyard in Cairanne is located south west of the old village. The soils are stony, made of clay and sand. The wine is fleshy and develops beautiful aromas of blackcurrant, Garrigue and liquorice.

THE VINTAGE

In 2010, all the right conditions were united to produce an exceptional vintage.

Heavy rainfall during spring, followed by a very hot summer and an Indian summer in September allowed for great harvest conditions.

This vintage produced very balanced wines with intense notes of fruit and great finesse.

LOCATION

In the heart of the historical vineyard, south west of the hilltop village between Rasteau and Sainte Cécile Les Vignes

Sparse clay and gravel terraces. Sandy Molasses.

AGEING

Traditionally kept in stainless steel tanks after crushing. Pumping-over twice a day

VARIETALS

Grenache, Syrah

Appearance: A bright red hue.

Nose: Expressive nose of very ripe fruit.

Palate: On the palate it appears rich and fullbodied, with silky tannins and good length and balance.

"Other wines under the Perrin et Fils label include the potentially outstanding 2010 Cotes du Rhone-Villages Cairanne Pierres Blanches from a biodynamically farmed site. Cairanne tends to produce cool climate, earthy wines with a lot of pepper and spice notes, and, in this case, notions of raspberries and sweet, dusty cherries. There is a nice interaction between sweet and sour cherries in this medium to full-bodied, cool climate styled wine."

"Bright ruby. Fresh red berry and floral aromas are lifted by a spicy note. Juicy and seamless on the palate, with sweet raspberry and cherry flavors dominating. Finishes smooth and long, with resonating spiciness and very good clarity."

"The 2010 Côtes du Rhône-Villages Cairanne Peyre Blanche (75 Grenache, 20 Syrah and 5 Mourvèdre) is tightly wound, with a tangy, almost chalky spine holding the red currant, bitter cherry and damson plum notes which ripple through the very focused finish. The 2010 Gigondas La Gille, sourced from sandy soils in the middle terraces of the appellation, is an 80/20 Grenache and Syrah blend. It's very precise, with beautiful lilting spice, black tea and lightly mulled black cherry aromas, followed by silky tannins and a long, graceful finish that stands apart from the pack in the appellation. This is very long, with deceptive depth, but it wins now on brightness and balance, which should hold it for some time."
