



## CHÂTEAU DE BEUCASTEL



### Château de Beaucastel Châteauneuf-du-Pape Blanc Roussanne Vieilles Vignes 2014

#### PRESENTATION

Considered as one of the greatest white wines in France, only 6000 bottles of this wine are produced. It's made with 100% very old Roussanne vines and harvested slightly over ripe. This exceptional wine must be drunk within 3 years or after 15 years. To be enjoyed with gastronomic cuisine.

#### THE VINTAGE

The 2014 vintage is surprising for the region. It is characterised by a mild, damp winter, a hot and dry spring and a temperate and humid summer. An unusual year, a winemaker year. Bud break was very early, flowering took place in ideal conditions and fruit set was excellent, especially on Grenache. However, work in the vineyard and rigorous monitoring of the vineyard until harvest were necessary with wet months of July and August, favouring the vegetative growth. The harvest of white grapes took place under bright sunshine, with very nice analytical balances.

#### LOCATION

Château de Beaucastel has 7 hectares planted with white varieties.

#### TERROIR

Molasse seabed of the Miocene period covered by diluvial alpine deposits (rolled pebbles).

#### AGEING

The grapes are hand picked in small cases and sorted, pneumatically pressed. Settling of the juices and fermentation (30% in oak, 70% tanks). Bottled after 8 months.

#### VARIETAL

Roussanne 100%

#### SERVING

14°C in tasting glasses.

#### TASTING

A beautiful bright yellow color with green highlights.

The nose is discreet, stylish and elegant, with notes of rose petals and beeswax.

In the mouth the wine grows and turns rich, with notes of Gingerbread, cinnamon, clove and white pepper.

The finish is beautifully balanced between salinity and minerality.

Explosive, mineral-accented aromas of tangerine, poached pear and jasmine show superb clarity and pick up ginger, nougat and chamomile nuances as the wine opens up. Juicy, densely packed citrus and orchard fruit avors thoroughly stain the palate and become more energetic with air. The mineral and oral notes come back emphatically on the strikingly long and incisive nish, which shows impressive, nery tenacity and focus."

"A big step up over the classic cuvee (which isn't always a given), the 2014 Châteauneuf du Pape Roussanne Vieilles Vignes is 100% Roussanne from ancient vines, some of which are over 100 years in age. A deeper, richer version of the traditional cuvee, it reveals a medium-gold color to go with sensational notes of white currants, quince, brioche, honeysuckle and lemon curd. Full-bodied, beautifully concentrated and rich, yet with plenty of acidity, drink this elegant, balanced beauty anytime over the coming 2-3 decades."

## Decanter

"Now 11 years old, this is taking on some colour, a touch of gold. Lovely open nose of almond, quince jelly and poached pears, which are repeated on the palate, with a touch of saffron to the pear fruit. Delightful sense of tension, it's very fresh, saline and beginning to take on mineral notes. It smells 'like opening a beehive', according to winemaker César Perrin. Lovely sense of freshness and tension, it has now arrived at its mineral phase and is drinking brilliantly. From a single parcel of Roussanne, planted in 1919 and grown biodynamically."
